

Minutes of the Elk Run Cemetery Meeting
February 6, 1931

A meeting of the ERC board was held at the Bank of Elkton. The President E B Coffman presiding. The following members were present: A B Cover, T H Cave, J O Harnsberger, and CHJ Blose. The minutes were called for, read and approved.

A motion was made, seconded and carried that the president appoint a committee of two to go to Fort Defiance and learn from that cemetery how they arrange for perpetual care of lots, and any other information that may be of interest to our board. The president appointed A B Cover and W E Kite.

There being a vacancy in the board of trustees caused by the death of our esteemed friend W E Kite. Hue Frey was nominated to fill the vacancy, was seconded and unanimously carried.

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As custodians of the grounds in which rest the bodies of our departed loved ones, and not having sufficient income to keep the grounds in such condition indicative of their cherished memory. We, the undersigned trustees of Elk Run Cemetery Association, at a meeting of said trustees held in the town of Elkton, VA on the 6th of February, 1931, adopted the following resolution in conformity to Sections No. 11 and 14 of the By Laws, Rules and Regulations of the Elk Run Cemetery Association of Elkton, VA. "Beginning on January 1, 1931, and continuing until further public notice is given, all persons owning land within the bounds of said Elk Run Cemetery Association, is assessed the sum of two dollars on each whole lot, and one dollar on each half lot, to be paid by said lot owners to the secretary of said board of trustees of said Elk Run Cemetery Association, on or before the 1st day of July of each and every year thereafter, and no interment shall be made within the bounds of said cemetery without written permission from the treasurer of said Elk Run Cemetery Association, who shall not issue a permit for that purpose to any person who may be in arrears in the payment of the foregoing assessment.
