

## **Minutes of the Elk Run Cemetery Meeting**

June 15, 1936

### **First Meeting After the Death of C. H. J. Blose.**

At the meeting of the Elk Run Cemetery Board at the Bank of Elkton, VA, June 15, 1936. The meeting was called to order by its President E. B. Coffman, and on motion H. T. Frey was elected secretary. Members present were: A. B. Cover, J. G. Harnesberger, and H. T. Frey. T. H. Cave requested that his name be dropped from the Cemetery Board; and on motion moved and seconded, Mr. Cave was dropped from the Board of Trustees. It was moved and seconded to add A. E. Wyant to the list of Trustees; and also to serve as secretary and Treasurer. His duties are to make collections, sell lots, issue burial permits, and pay all bills by order from the President of the Cemetery Association for which he is to receive for his services 10% of all collections made from upkeep funds from lots, which may have accumulated during past years, present years, and future years, as long as he acts as secretary and Treasure of the said association.

The said funds now deposited in the Bank of Elkton, VA to the credit of the said C. H. J. Blose decil and E. B. Coffman shall be transferred in the names of A. E. Wyant and E. B. Coffman in said bank. It was also moved and seconded and so ordered to demand a deposit of \$1.00 be made before issuing a permit for the burial of any ones relatives or friends wish to dig at grave of the said relative or friend other than the keeper of the said cemetery, to assure the removal of all dirt or rocks from the said burial lot; and if the said lot or grave is left in a decent and satisfactory condition to the said keeper or caretaker of the said cemetery; then the said \$1.00 shall be refunded to the relative or neighbor doing the digging of the grave and making the burial her said body. And it is further ordered that the amount due on the upkeep of lot or mowed of any grave must be paid in full before a permit is granted for a burial. No other business before the board on motion it adjourned.
